COVID-19 Checklist for Garage Sales and Outdoor Retail Sales

Protecting Against COVID-19

Spring and summer are when we see garage sales, yard sales, and other outdoor sales pop up all over Ohio. Ohio Department of Health Director Amy Acton, M.D., MPH, strongly recommends that Ohioans take the following actions when having and/or attending these sales.

- Practice social distancing by doing the following:
 - a. Place posters encouraging social distancing for customers to see upon arrival and while shopping.
 - b. Set up tables and chairs within 6 feet apart.
 - c. Use heavy-duty tape to form a flow for customers to follow throughout the sale.
 - d. Ask customers to stand in a line, while spread apart, during a high traffic times.
- Clean all tables and chairs several times throughout the day.
 - a. Make sure all merchandise is washed and dried and/or wiped down with a disinfectant product before placing on a table or chair for sale.
 - b. Wipe down all tables and chairs using disinfectant at the end of the day or in the morning before the next day of the sale starts.
- Wear masks and disposable gloves at all times during the sale.
- Have hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol on tables and other places for customers to use.

CHAPTER 757 Garage Sales

757.01 DEFINITION.

"Garage sale" means the display or advertisement for sale of five or more articles of tangible personal property in any "R" or "AR" Zoning District within the City.
(Ord. 24-73. Passed 4-9-73.)

757.02 LOCATIONS WHERE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED.

No person or persons or corporation shall publicly sell or offer for sale five or more articles of tangible personal property in any residential or accessory structure or yard located in any "R-16", "R-10", "R-7.5", "R-6.5", "AR-3.5", or "AR-4.5" District without first having obtained a permit for such sale from the office of the Director of Safety and without first having paid the required fee as provided in Section 757.03. (Ord. 24-73. Passed 4-9-73.)

757.03 PERMIT APPLICATION; FEE; FREQUENCY OF ISSUE.

Application for such permits shall be submitted to the City Clerk and must be approved by the Director of Safety, or designee, prior to issuance after a fee of five dollars (\$5.00) is paid. Only one such permit shall be issued for a single address in any twelve-month period and shall be valid for not more than three consecutive days or two consecutive weekends of two days each. A Change in ownership shall result in the start of a new twelve-month period.
(Ord. 18-2014. Passed 5-19-14.)

757.04 SALE ADVERTISING.

Signs announcing the sale shall be limited to one on-premises sign and two off-premises signs. No signs shall be located in a public right-of-way. No signs may be affixed to street signs, utility poles, trees, fences, buildings or any other object. All signs may be erected the night before the garage sale event and shall be removed immediately at the end of the sale. The sign or placard may be no larger than four square feet and must be without illumination, movement or illusion of movement. (Ord. 18-2014. Passed 5-19-14.)

757.05 PERMIT REFUSAL.

The Director of Safety may refuse to issue the required permit for any sale which, in his judgment, would be detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the community or to the residential character of the neighborhood, it being the intention to restrict such sales to casual sales of reasonably limited amounts of tangible personal property.

(Ord. 24-73. Passed 4-9-73.)

757.06 APPLICATION DEADLINE; SALES AFTER SUNSET PROHIBITED.

Application for such sale shall be made prior to the first day of the sale. No sale shall be conducted either in whole or in part after sunset. (Ord. 18-2014. Passed 5-19-14.)

757.07 SALES UNDER COURT ORDER EXEMPTED.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the sale of tangible personal property made under any court order. (Ord. 24-73. Passed 4-9-73.)

757.99 PENALTY.

Whoever violates any provision of this chapter is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for each offense. Each day on which a violation occurs or continues shall be a separate offense.
