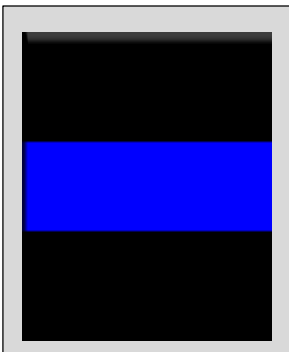

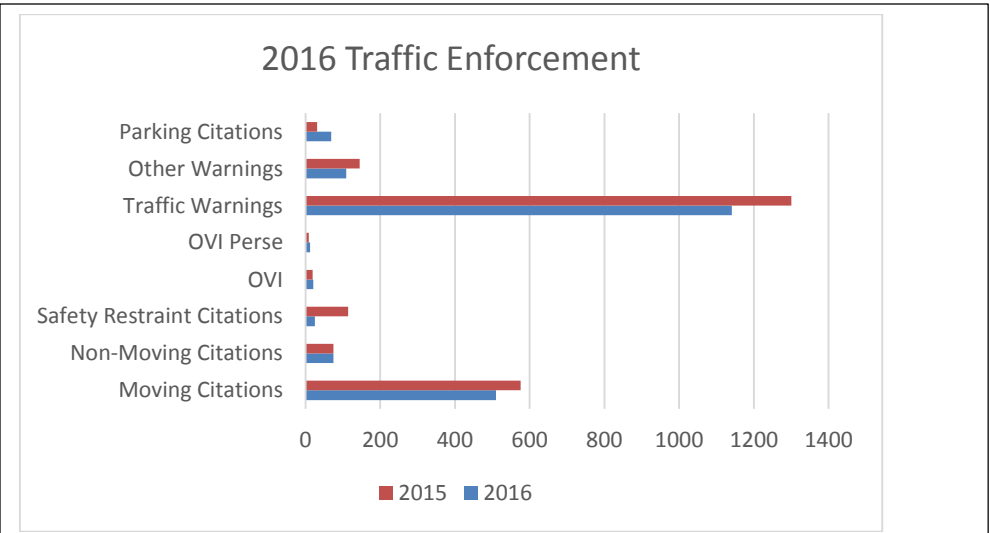
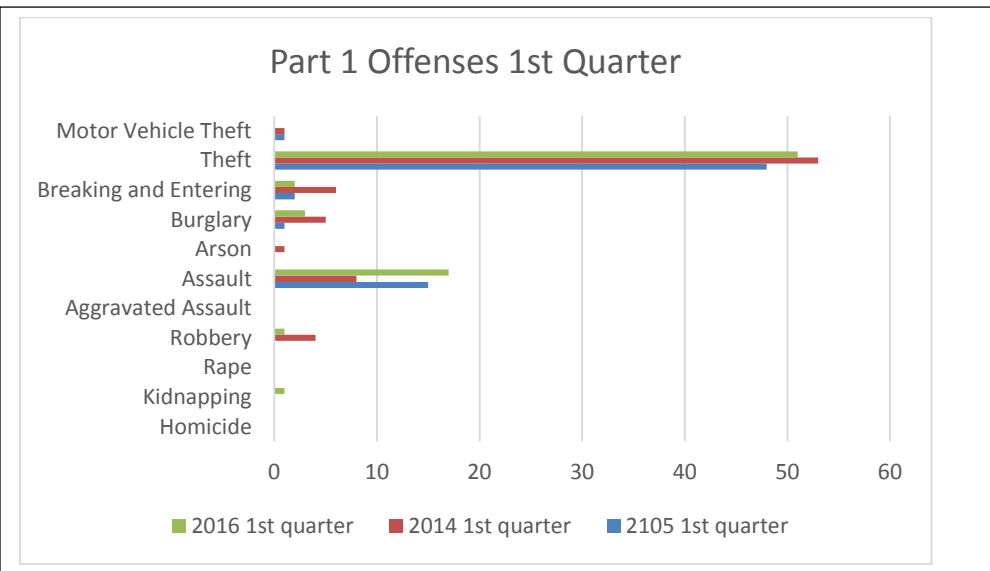
Quick Facts

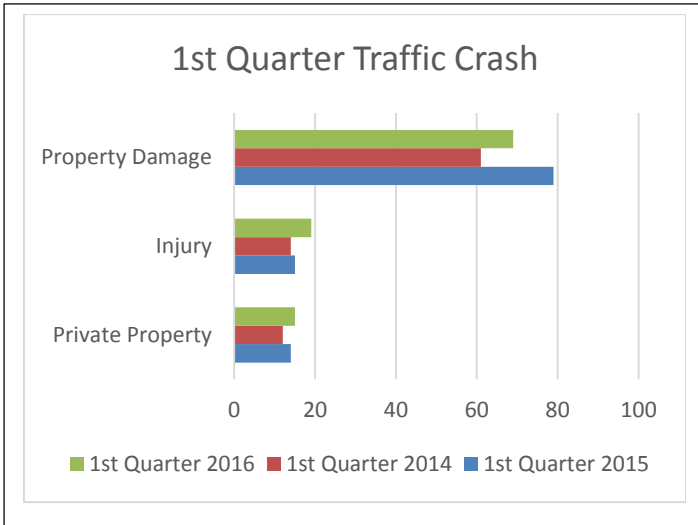

Notable Initiatives & Activities

- Division of Police currently involved in hiring at least two officers as Officers Paxton, Hurst and Chief Mosaic are retiring
- Officer Allton was struck by a vehicle during a traffic stop and is recovering at home
- Suspects were identified and charged in the theft of three trailers
- The Buckeye Bandit robbed Farmers Citizens Bank. The Buckeye Bandit is suspected in 23 bank robberies since September 2013
- Kaleb Kirkpatrick was returned to Ohio. He is suspected in 11 burglaries in Worthington. He is currently at the Orient Correctional Institution
- Communication Technician Megan Zhang was released from training and we anticipate a reduction in overtime in our communication center.
